Facilitator Report

John Ysursa handed out one folder for each club for this meeting. The folders have information on items that are being covered at this meeting and other NABO information that might be of interest to the individual clubs. Also it is a place for the delegates to put flyers and other information to give to their members and their board.

There are many items in the folder and John would like the delegate to look at the items and if they have questions or want to discuss the items, the delegates and contact John. He did review a few of the items that are included in the folders:

Mission Statement: On the website, John has posted a first draft of a possible Mission Statement for NABO. He asked for some input from the delegates on what NABO should have in a Mission Statement. He would like some dialog on what is the best way to frame our organization when outsiders want to know about NABO. He feels that this may be an item to discuss as a forum. If possible, he would like to have an initial Mission Statement to present to the delegate by our next meeting.

Gaztealdi: John hopes the delegates are promoting Gaztealdi to their clubs. Information can be found www.nabasque.org. The cost of the workshop will be \$45.00. The theme of the workshop is “Gaztealde—on behalf/support of Youth!” John is looking for a few good people who will step up to and serve as teachers of Basque history and culture. This workshop will provide those involved with the means to teach more people of all ages about the Basques. After the workshop, each participant will be prepared to present a one-hour general introduction of Basque accompanied with video, audio & images that will be provided. This is a three day workshop that will be held in Boise, for ages 16 years old and up. The dates are July 25th through July 27th Followed by the St. Ignatius Basque Festival on July 28th & 29th (Saturday through Sunday).

Cultural Tour: There is a band that is sponsored by the Basque Government to come to the states and give concerts to Basque Clubs. There are two possible windows of time for them to be in the US. The window can be either from August 31st to September 10th or September 7th to 17th. We already have two clubs that would like to host them but we need at least two more clubs to host them. If your club can put together an event to have this band play, please let John know this weekend. They have to book the tour by Sunday, June 10th.

NABO Regions Discussion Groups: After lunch, the delegates will break into groups by Regions to get to know each other and to discuss having joint events.

Four Year Plan for NABO: John would like the delegates to fill out a survey about what is of interest to their clubs. This information will help the NABO Representative who will be going to World Congress, to complete the NABO Four Year Plan and present it at the Congress. There is information on NABO's idea in the folder.

Logo of the Basques Around the World: What should be the NABO Logo? John showed a possible logo. If any one has an idea for a logo please let one of the NABO Representative know.

Hizketa: A copy of the last Hizketa is in the folder so the delegates can make copies and take it to their members.

Kantuketan: If anyone did not get a chance to check out Kantuketan, it is being displayed at the NABO convention. John encouraged everyone to go and listen to the great history of music.

Basque Studies Programs: The number of Basque Studies Programs in the US is growing. This is offering more opportunities for Basque Studies Consortiums and the sharing of Basque Information. This is good for all of the Basque communities.

North American Summit: John announced that as a result of the North American Summit that NABO hosted in October, 2006, Vancouver and Montreal, Canada are preparing to put in a bid for membership to NABO. Mexico also could put in bid.

John made two motions:

#1 He motioned that in a portion of NABO presentation in the Basque Congress, the NABO delegation stand shoulder to shoulder with the FEVA delegation to show we plan to join together and collaboration on these five areas 1) promote communicate 2) promote education, 3) promote an oral history of the Basques, 4) promote Basque all around the world, 5) promote Basque Folk Dancing. The motion was seconded, and after discussion was passed.

#2 He motioned that at the congress, NABO invites the delegates from Canada and Mexico to stand with us, for a minute or two, to show solidarity. The motion was seconded and after discussion was passed.

As a result of this last motion, there was discussion of what happens in the International Mus and Pilota Tournaments if Canada, Vancouver and Mexico join NABO. John mentioned that these clubs want to retain their own International Tournaments and the United States will retain its own International Tournaments.

Mary thanked John Ysursa, Valerie Arrechea, Lisa Corcostegui, Gina Anchustegui Gridley, Philippe Acheritogaray and Xabier Berrueta for all their hard work in preparing for the International Congress.

Mus

Victor Esain thanked the San Francisco Basque Cultural Center for hosting the 2007 NABO Mus Tournament. It was a great Tournament. There were 38 pairs that participated in the Tournament. Fidel Marcos and Pedro Marizcurrena, from Ventura, CA, took first place and will represent the United States in the 2007 International Tournament. The 2007 International Tournament will be held in Mar de Plata, Argentina in November. The 2008 International Tournament will be held in Barcelona, Spain. In 2009, it will be held in Montevideo, Uruguay.

Victor suggested that NABO should make a decision on when the United States will host the International Mus Tournament. Pierre felt that NABO should take the next Tournament so the motion was made that NABO be prepared to host the next International Mus Tournament. The motioned was seconded. During the decision, it was asked how NABO decides which individual club should host the Tournament. Pierre said that the Mus Chair goes from club to club and ask if they will host the Tournament. The first club that says maybe they will host it, gets to host it. There was also a question about whether NABO could afford to host the Tournament. Mary assured the delegates that NABO has enough money in the Mus account and Grace explained that the money comes from the fees the individual clubs pays for each Mus player in their Tournaments. The motion was passed.

Pierre Etcharren reported that he has checked on getting some Mus cards printed with a logo representing NABO on the back of the cards. He can get

2500 decks printed for \$2.29 each deck. He is sure that the Basque Clubs will buy the cards. Pierre made a motion that NABO have some Mus cards printed with the NABO logo. Anita Anacabe Franzoia suggested that the NABO website address be put on the card. There was a question on what the logo would go on the back. Pierre said that the logo has not been decided yet but will probably be the NABO logo with the website address. The Motion was seconded and passed.

Pierre Etcharren mentioned that recently he has been asked if some of the Mus rules could be modified. He has not had a chance to review the request but said that in the NABO National Tournament, they try to use the International Tournament rules as closely as possible. Pierre clarified that the individual clubs and use their own rules for their Tournaments. He would be happy to research the request on the rules and bring a report to NABO. Mary agreed that Pierre should do this research and bring his suggestions to the next meeting.

Gina Espinal reported that tomorrow the NABO Jr. Mus Tournament would be held. She said they would wait until all the teams had arrived to decide what time the Tournament would be held. There will be three teams coming.

Gina also mentioned that even though only three would be in Winnemucca for the NABO Tournament there was several clubs that had a club Jr. Mus Tournament but the winners were not to come to the NABO Tournament. She also had requests from two clubs for instructions on how to put on a Jr. Mus Tournament. Gina was very happy with efforts made by the clubs to hold Jr. Mus Tournaments

Udaleku

Valerie Arrechea reported that the 2007 Udaleku will be held in San Francisco, CA from June 17th to June 29th. There are 75 children participating in Udaleku. Sixty Seven of those participating are from outside the Bay Area and are being housed by host families. There are three participants from Canada and four from the Basque Country. The participants will have camp classes and will have an afternoon of bowling. They will also have a picnic at Angel Island State Park and will attend a Giant's baseball game.

The Udaleku 2008 will be held in the Northern Region of NABO, which includes Idaho and Wyoming. Valerie would like to know by the next meeting where the 2008 Udaleku will be held.

Valerie mentioned that even though it runs well, it does not hurt to look at Udaleku every once in a while to see if it can be improved. This year it came to the organizer attention that some children that have attended many of the camps were just relearning the same things over and over. The children wanted to learn something new. So this year San Francisco tried taking one Province and teaching about that Province. Next year, whoever hosts Udaleku will be assigned another Province. Not only will this make each Udaleku different but it also allows the hosting club to focus on what kind of instructors they will need.

Deadline for the Udaleku application was May 1 and the deadline work out great. Parents usually know early what their children will be doing during the summer. Valerie suggested we make May 1st the deadline for every Udaleku. It would make it easier for parents to remember the deadline from year to year and it would make it easier for the hosting club to know who is registered so they can set up housing, staff and everything else.

The Txistu Workshop for adults will not be held the same week as Udaleku. With everything she has had to organize this summer, Valerie was not able to organize this workshop. But she will still work on getting it organized.

It was suggested that the workshops for adult be held on a weekend so people would not have to take time off from work to attend the workshop. Valerie will try to plan these events over a weekend.

It was asked if there was any finger chart or instruction for the Txistu so they can start learning. Valerie suggested loading the Note Worthy Composer program onto their computer because she is going to put some music on to this program for the Udaleku children so they can keep learning and the adults can also use these programs. She will start putting the music on the NABO website some time after June 30th.

Kantari Eguna

Kantari Eguna will be held in Gardnerville, NV this year. It will be held on August 11th in conjunction with their picnic. If you know anyone who would like to sing please have them sign up.

John Ysursa mentioned that Chino had offered to host Kantari Eguna in 2008 in conjunction with their convention. But they have decided to have all their events on Saturday and Sunday. Because of the time constrains, they cannot have a standard Kantari Eguna in Chino so they are offering to let some other club host the 2008 Kantari Eguna. Please let John know if you would like to host the event. He hopes to know by the Fall NABO meeting.

Pilota

Mary reported that the 2007 NABOkO PILOTAKO TXAPLEKETA will be held in Bakersfield, California in November. No other report.

Calendar Report

Mary reported that Mary Lou wanted her to announce that the 2008 Calendars would be available in mid July. Mary also indicated that Mary Lou would try to get a few calendar printed early, so the NABO delegates can take them to the International Basque Conference.

Video

Mary welcomed Jose Felix Azumendi Badiola, Director International Channels for EITB and Juan Pedro Arin San Martin, Commercial Representative for CANAL VASCO for American.

Jesus Pedroarena reported that the only request from for videos was received yesterday from Argentina for the 2000 Gaztamundo video/DVD but since Valerie Arrechea handles the requests for that video, it was forwarded to her.

In March, Jesus noticed that there was a problem with the pricing of the three month package. He called them and they took care of the problem right away.

JumpTV now has 90 channels that are free to watch. Even if you are not a subscriber you can watch some channels free.

Jesus turned the rest of his time over to Jose Felix Azumendi Badiola and Juan Pedro Arin San Martin for a presentation on EITB and CANAL VASCO and what it has to offer. John will put their presentation on the NABO website.

History

Argitxu Camus Etchecopar reported that the NABO archive has been has been collected and organized and stored at the Basque Library at the University of Nevada in Reno. A detailed description of the archive is ready.

Argitxu still has to organize the photographs she has collected and when she does this she will add them to the archive.

With the help of Grace Mainvil and Victor Esain, they were able to find the missing NABO minutes. She now has all the NABO minutes since NABO began. They will be in archive with the rest of the NABO items. Argitxu has also given Valerie Arrechea a copy of all the missing minutes. So she now has a complete set, also.

John Ysursa will make all the various issues of Hizketa available to be stored at the Basque Library of the University of Nevada, Reno.

Since the last meeting, Argitxu has made all the corrections to the dates and locations of the Convention Festival, NABO Mus Tournament locations, Pelota final locations, and the music camps locations, as well as when the clubs joined NABO.

A book on the history of NABO will be published in July by the Basque Autonomous Government. It will be presented at the World Congress of Basque Collectivities held in Bilbao.

Argitxu would like to thank everyone who has provided her with missing with missing bylaws and/or articles of incorporation. She is still missing some so if you have not sent yours please do so as soon as possible.

Valerie Arrechea suggested that the individual clubs send to NABO a list of the Board of Directors, Officers, and NABO Delegates. It would be very helpful to NABO and would help to keep the information in the archive updated. So please have your club's secretary send a list of the officers in your clubs to both the NABO History Chair and the NABO Secretary.

Argitxu also mentioned that she would love to receive your club's newsletters.

Euskara

Martin Goicoechea sends his regrets that he was not able to attend. He asked John Ysursa to give his report at the meeting.

1. They are moving forward with Euskara and are excited they have been able to get a trained professional teacher of Euskara. The teacher is Izaskun Kortazar and she is from the Basque Country and is a fluent Basque teacher. She will be able to prepare the lessons so the teachers will not have to develop lessons. They will just have to open a book with the lessons in it. They are planning to put together a workshop for the teachers later in the fall and they hope to have the books available there.
2. Martin asked John if he would put forth a motion that NABO make available the opportunity to solicited money for Euskara on the web. It was noted that since this donation would be through NABO, they need NABO approval. The motion includes a request that a link be added to the web page that would allow anyone to make a donation. So John made a motion that NABO allow NABO Euskara to make available for any person and/or organization to make a donation of money that would

go toward the promotion and teaching of Euskara. A link would be added to the NABO website. The motion was seconded. Grace mentioned that the deduction would be tax deductible since it is in the Educational Fund. The tax deductible number for the Educational Fund is on the treasurer report. If you have any questions about this number or which one it is, please contact Grace. After discussion the motion was approved.

3. The Bertsu Book is still available on the NABO Website.

Aurrera Goaz

Anita Anacabe Franzoia reported she is so busy that she is concerned that she no longer has time to devote to being the Chair of the Aurrera Goaz . She hopes that someone will step up to become the Chair of this committee. She does not have a report for today's meeting,

Mary read a letter from Tlale Ouret and the Artzain Mundua that asks for a donation from NABO to go toward a monument that will honor the Basque Shepherders. Pierre Etcharren explained that there were many of these Basque Shepherders worked here in the Western United State. Pierre made a motion that NABO donate \$1000.00 to be used on this project for the memorial monument. John Ysursa added to the motion that Pierre be authorized to make the decision of the donation up to \$1000.00. The motions were seconded and after some discussion the motions were approved. Pierre announced that he will contact Artzain Mundua that a check from NABO for \$1000.00 will be mailed for the project.

Membership Committee's Report:

Pierre Etcharren reported that Santa Rosa Basque Club's membership documents were complete except for their registration with the Basque Government, which is in the process of being accepted. The membership committee proposed that Santa Rosa Basque Club be approved for provisional membership into NABO on the condition that they submit their missing documents to NABO as soon as they received them. They will be non voting members until the paper are submitted to NABO. Pierre motioned that the Santa Rosa Basque Club be accepted into the NABO membership. The motion was seconded and approved.

Philippe Acheritogaray reported that his committee reviewed the application for Washington D.C. Euskal Etxea and found all their papers to be in order and complete. The Committee motioned that the Washington D.C. Euskal Etxea be accepted into the NABO membership. The motion was seconded and approved.

Elections

John Ysursa conducted the Elections for NABO. The offices that are being voted on are the NABO President and NABO Treasurer. There was also a question of how many NABO Vice Presidents should there be in the leadership of NABO. Valerie explained that the first Vice President is always the outgoing president. The second Vice President is appointed at the discretion of NABO. Pierre Etcharren indicated that at times it is helpful to have a second Vice President to be available to attend the clubs' events when the President and 1st Vice President were not available. Bob Echeverria made a motion that the second Vice President be eliminated. Since there was already a question on the ballot as to whether a second Vice President position was necessary, it was decided that the delegates would use the ballot to vote on the question.

Nominations from the floor were opened for the position of President and Treasurer. Valerie Arrechea was nominated to run for P0resident but she declined the nomination. There were no other nominations from the floor and nominations were closed.

Future NABO Meetings:

Mary reported that many of the NABO delegates were concerned about the number of NABO meetings that have being held on Fridays. Mary said that for awhile the club hosting the meeting has made the decision about which day the NABO meeting would be held. But the by-laws state that it is the delegates that should set the date of the meeting. So while NABO will try to work with the hosting club on the time of month the meetings will be held, the delegates will ask for a Saturday meeting day. An exception might be made for the Delegates' Meeting at the NABO Convention, when approved by the delegates.

During this discussion, Lisa Corcostegui mentioned that Ontario, Oregon would be hosting the Basque Hall of Fame. The Ontario Club members were concerned about how people could go to both the meeting slated to take place in Reno and the Hall of Fame to take place in Ontario Oregon. After talking to the delegates from Reno, Lisa proposed that the fall meeting be held in Ontario,

Oregon on November 10th instead of in Reno. John Ysursa counter motioned that Reno and Ontario work out the details and let the delegate know as soon as possible. This motion was seconded and passed.

Argia Beristain Dougherty made a motion that the 2009 NABO Convention be held in Washington D.C. and that it be hosted by the Washington D.C. Euskal Etxea in Washington D.C. The motion was seconded and approved.

Results of Elections:

John announced the results of the elections:

Mary was reelected as NABO President.

Grace was reelected as NABO Treasurer.

NABO will served by only one Vice President.

Mary thanked the delegates for their confidence. She also invited all the delegates to come to her with any problems, concerns and ideas concerning NABO. Mary indicated that she has asked Pierre Etcharren to be the Chair of the Mus Committee and she would like Victor Esain to remain on the Committee as Vice Chair of the Mus Committee. Mary explained that Pierre Etcharren has been the NABO International Mus Chair. They are eliminating the word International and so Pierre will now be the Chair. She also asked all the remaining Committee Chairs to stay in their positions for at least one more year.

Valerie announced that Mayte Ocafrain will be organizing a tour to Mar de Plata, Argentina for the International Mus Tournament. So if you are interested in going to Mar de Plata, contact her.

Also for those that interested in purchasing a copy of the group picture that was taken at the San Francisco Basque Cultural Center in February, 2007, please contact Valerie.

Treasurer's Report Approval

Grace Mainvil explained that the date on the Treasurer's Report was incorrect and she asked everyone to make a change today's date. She also mentioned that she has made the change to separate out the HABE money from the educational account and has set up a separate HABE report. She then explained Treasurer's Account.

She reminded those clubs that have Pilota frontons need to pay \$100.00 a year to NABO. This fee goes to the membership fees to belong to US Pilota Federation.

Grace mentioned that the Fresno Basque Club had made a donation of \$500 to the Udaleku account to help San Francisco put on this year's Udaleku. She also noted that the San Francisco Cultural Center has made three different donations. Two of the donations went to Mus and one to Pilota. Grace will put these donations into the Mus and Pilota accounts.

After discussion of the Treasurer's Report, Josephine Arriet made a motioned that the Treasurer's Report be accepted. The motion was seconded and passed.

Grace announced that she several NABO items for sale.

John Ysursa reminded the delegates that right after the NABO meeting adjourns; the delegates should get into groups by regions so they can meet the other clubs in their regions and start planning for some joint events.

A motion was made to adjourn the NABO meeting it was seconded and approved.

Future Meeting

Fall Meeting 2007 in Ontario, Oregon on November 10, 2007
