Nolakoa(ak) da (dira)? What is (are) (they) he like?

Lasaia(ak) da (dira). He (They) is (are) calm

Nola cannot be decline it is invariable

Nola dago (daude)? How is (are) he (they)?

Lasai dago (daude). He (they) is (are) calm.

Nolakoa uses an adjective in the response, and references all the qualities of someone or something, it expresses something that is permanent or lasting.

- Nolakoa da arbola hori? What is that tree like?
- Arbola hori bereinkatua da. That tree is blessed.
