Grammar Point:

The nouns and adjectives above are in their natural “naked” form.

To say a/the we add an -A to the end of word (if the word ends in an “r” we double the “r” and an “a”, if the word ends in an “a” we don’t add another).

To say some/the and make it plural, we add an -AK to the end of the word (if the word ends in an “r” we double the “r” and add an “ak”, if the word ends in an “a” we add only a “k”).

Singular	-A	haurRA zaharRA mendiA bihotzA pilota	a/the child a/the elderly (person) a/the mountain a/the heart a/the ball
Plurala	-AK	haurRAK zaharRAK mendiAK bihotzAK pilotaK	some/the children some/the elderly (people) some/the mountains some/the hearts some/the balls
