Grammar Point:

There are two conjugations of the verb IZAN (to be) in this song. Without going into a long explanation of transitive and intransitive verbs (verbs that have a direct object and verbs that do not), and all the other things we need to take into account when constructing a sentence, we will look at the two verbs, IZAN (to be) and BEHAR IZAN (have to/must) in a simple way.

IZAN (intransitive) no object	BEHAR IZAN (transitive) direct object
Gara	Behar dugu
Gu = we	Guk = we
Gu gara	Guk behar dugu
We are	we have to/must
Gu euskaldunak gara.	Guk (mendia) igo behar dugu.
We are Basques.	We have to climb the mountain.
